1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

The passage deals with the rapture.

Paul writes this part of the letter because he does "not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope."

Greek – Luke 16:23 Άδης Hadés – place of the dead ~Hadés used 10 times in N.T.~

Hell

Greek – Matthew 10:28 γέεννα geenna or Gehenna ~Gehenna used 12 times in N.T.~

a valley west and South of Jerusalem; the final place of punishment of the ungodly - Mark 9:43 (Lake of Fire – Revelation 21:8)

What do we know so far?

- 1. Heaven and hell are real places in the Bible.
- 2. People possess body, soul, and spirit.
- 3. Christians go to be with Jesus when they die.
- 4. Since their body dies, they must be with Jesus in a non-physical state.

So what will that state be?





Jesus, the Firstfruits

1 Corinthians 15:22-23 - For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive. But each one in his own order: Christ the <u>firstfruits</u>, afterward those who are Christ's at His coming.

Jesus, the Pattern for our glorified bodies

Philippians 3:20-21 - But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself.

Jesus was in an intermediate state of being.





Status Intermedius - Intermediate State
We are in an intermediate state until Christ returns to
resurrect our human bodies and reunite them
with our spirits and souls.

Paradise

When God created humans, He created them with a body and a soul and a spirit and placed them in the Garden – Paradise – where the tree of life is — where they were to rule over the newly created earth. When they sinned they were banished from the Garden.

Genesis 1:26-30; 2:8-9 & 15; 3:23-24





Paradise

When Jesus returns He will raise us up with a resurrected body, soul, and spirit, and place us in the Garden – Paradise – where the tree of life is – where we will rule with Jesus over the New Heaven and the New Earth. Once we were banished from the Garden because of our sin and now we will dwell there for all eternity because of the sacrificial death of Jesus who paid the price for our sin and rose again as firstfruits.





Final Answer

When we die we leave our physical bodies behind and spiritually go to be with Jesus.

When Jesus returns we will have our bodies restored as glorified and perfected bodies in which we will enjoy eternity in the New Heaven and the New Earth.





How Should We Then Live?

As Paul said, we should "encourage one another with these words." We should encourage fellow believers and we should encourage non-believers to look forward to that day when we lay aside these mortal bodies and meet Christ face to face.
